Obituary **NORAH WILLIAMS**

We have just learned that Miss Norah Williams who learned to ring at Hillingdon during the First World War died peacefully in a nursing home in Southport, Lancashire on March 29 last. Miss Williams was, in her day, a very capable and popular ringer, particularly with the Ladies' Guild and in the Bath, Somerset, area to which she moved in 1923. Mr. Fred Goodfellow of Hillingdon, to whom we acknowledge this information, tells us that Miss Williams taught his wife, the late Mrs. Grace Goodfellow in Sunday School at Hillingdon and both died within a few weeks of each other.
