QUARTER PEAL REPORT

The total number of quarter peals rung during the approximate period 1 November 2010 to 31 October 2011 and published in the Ringing World was 1098 - 50 more than in 2010; these were rung in 277 towers, 21 more than last year. For the first time since I've been compiling this report, the number of towers that 20% of the quarters were rung in has increased to 7 towers. There has been a decrease in both the number of members ringing their first quarter and conducting for the first time. The number of occasions on which someone either rang or conducted something new has however increased substantially. Of the 127 Surprise Minor quarters rung only 53 were of Cambridge, and of the 126 Surprise Major quarters rung only 27 were of Yorkshire or Cambridge. Considering that only 41% of Surprise Minor quarters and nearly 21% of Surprise Major quarters were of Cambridge or Yorkshire, this suggests that ringers have generally widened their repertoires compared with last year, although there has been a decrease in quarter peals on higher numbers of bells.

The top three towers were unchanged, Bathwick were again the leading tower ringing 49 quarters, followed by, Worle (40) and Durleigh (36).

There was 1 quarter peal of Singles, 1 of Minimus, 456 of Doubles (of which 67 were Grandsire, 47 Plain Bob and 10 Stedman), 292 of Minor (of which 127 were Surprise and 73 were Plain Bob), 137 of Triples (of which 91 were Grandsire, 15 Stedman & 15 Plain Bob), 165 of Major (of which 126 were Surprise and 26 were Plain Bob), 22 of Caters (of which 17 were Grandsire & 1 Stedman), 15 of Royal (of which 11 were Surprise), 3 of Cinques, 1 of Maximus (which was of Surprise).

As so many quarters are no longer published in the Ringing World it has been decided not to include individual tower totals in the Annual Report. I will however continue to record the details of the number of quarter peals published in the Ringing World for each tower which I will supply to anyone who requests them.

28 members rang their first quarter peal, 11 members rang their first inside and on 504 occasions someone rang something new. 3 members conducted their first quarter peal and 81 conducted a new method.

13 quarter peals were rung on handbells, eight at Piglet-in-the-wild, Marston Bigot (seven of Plain Bob Minor and one of Plain Bob Major), one at Northside, Bath (of Cambridge Surprise Minor), two at Jaycroft Road, Burnham-on-Sea (one of St.Clements Bob Major and one of Plain Bob Major) and two at Beaufort Avenue, Midsomer Norton (one of Plain Bob Minor and one of St.Clements Minor).
