QUARTER PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

The total number of quarter peals rung during the approximate period 1 November 2011 to 31 October 2012 and published in the Ringing World was 1187 - 92 more than in 2011; these were rung in 272 towers, 4 fewer than last year. 20% of the quarters were rung in 5 towers. The increase is largely down to three factors, extra ringing for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and the Olympics plus Andy Mead's challenge to ring more quarters in a year than anyone else. There has been a small decrease in the number of members ringing their first quarter but an increase in the number conducting for the first time. The number of occasions on which someone either rang or conducted something new has however increased substantially. Of the 114 Surprise Minor quarters rung only 59 were of Cambridge, and of the 98 Surprise Major quarters rung only 29 were of Yorkshire or Cambridge. 50% of Surprise Minor quarters and nearly 29% of Surprise Major quarters were of Cambridge or Yorkshire, this suggests a slight narrowing of ringing repertoires compared with last year, although there has also been an increase in quarter peals on higher numbers of bells.

There has been a dramatic change to this year's leading towers. For the first time Knapp's Farm Campanile is the leading tower ringing 82 quarters, followed by Worle (42) and West Cranmore and Pig-le-Tower (39).

There was 1 quarter peal of Singles, 9 of Minimus, 514 of Doubles (of which 79 were Grandsire, 54 Plain Bob and 7 Stedman), 1 of Doubles and Triples, 328 of Minor (of which 116 were Surprise and 60 were Plain Bob), 158 of Triples (of which 85 were Grandsire, 17 Stedman and 21 Plain Bob), 129 of Major (of which 99 were Surprise and 26 were Plain Bob), 23 of Caters (of which 17 were Grandsire and 5 Stedman), 18 of Royal (of which 15 were Surprise), 1 of Cinques, 5 of Maximus (of which 2 were Surprise).

25 members rang their first quarter peal, 12 members rang their first inside and on 626 occasions someone rang something new. 6 members conducted their first quarter peal and 93 conducted a new method.

8 quarter peals were rung on handbells two at Piglet-in-the-wild, Marston Bigot (one of Plain Bob Minor and one of Plain Bob Minimus), one at Home Mead, Marston Magna (of Kent TB Major), one at Jaycroft Road, Burnham-on-Sea (of Kent Treble Bob Major), one at The Laurels, Wedmore (of Double Bob Major), two at Knapps Farm, Doulting Beacon (both of St.Clements CB Minor) and one at Beaufort Avenue, Midsomer Norton (of Plain Bob Minor).
